Geography/Location

We are located in Auckland, New Zealand, with three vibrant and well-positioned campuses – Auckland (city), Manukau (South Auckland) and North Shore (across the Auckland Harbour Bridge). Auckland is New Zealand's largest and most cosmopolitan city with a population of 1.4 million – approximately 50% born in other countries. The urban area is twice the size of London and offers entertainment, nightlife and shopping. The temperate climate encourages an outdoor lifestyle and there is easy access to surf beaches, ski fields and mountains.

Our one year program, which has February and July intakes, is located at our beautiful North Shore campus. It consists of eight, 15 credit papers, four of which are campus based and four of which are placements in secondary schools. Assessment practices are competency based and designed to monitor progress through the eight papers. Graduates are provided with the knowledge, skills and capabilities to gain a rewarding career in secondary education.

The graduate program is a very successful program at AUT, with graduates being sought after by secondary schools. Lecturing staff have extensive experience as secondary teachers and teacher educators.

Our program is recognised by the NZ Teachers Council and upon graduation students are eligible for provisional registration in NZ.
